# El Nino slams The Huntington







### Reporting from the Front ...err, Back lot:

The first deluge from El Nino provided an awesome, inspiring moment on January 6<sup>th</sup> as it transformed the developing children's collecting stream at The Huntington from a dry wash to an authentic raging river. The site had been chosen to capture the run-off from the access road behind the Ikebana House and divert it along the streambed to an underground catch basin. It did its job and, as hoped, wet the stones in the process, but with an unexpected bonus: the amount of water had sufficient force to shift the stones and actually transport some downstream to begin the formation of natural bars.


The photos reveal some of our unique geological assemblage that currently consists of stones from at least nine California Rivers. Note that much of the brilliant color came from **Don Dupras** and **Robert McKenzie** of Sacramento – **Bob** has set aside another truckload for delivery later this year and **Ken McLeod** has promised a minor hill's worth. Another recent infusion of stones from northern rivers has just arrived by way of **Harry Hirao**'s backyard ... We may be reaching the point where we will have to erect some true-to-life barbed wire fences to keep local poachers out! In the meantime, be warned that we have embedded microchips in the red and yellow stones.

However we still have the three main projected sections of the stream to fill so the next time the rains hit, we hope you will don your slickers and make use of the opportunity to scan your yard and set aside the 'leaverite', and 'I'll-never-get-around-to-making-that-*daiza*' stones. Perhaps we will be able to seed another section of the streambed prior to the coming Bonsai-a-thon at the end of February ... and if it is still raining, see it in living color!

Before we officially incorporate the 'River/stream' into The Huntington – AVSRC programs, we would like to consider your suggestions and/or opinions with regard to a final identifying name. To date, 'River of Awakening', 'River of Discovery', 'River of Dreams', 'Stream of Dreams', 'Aisekigawa' and 'Tanseki-gawa' have been suggested. Maybe something more pedestrian such as 'The Creek' might be preferable? Give us your thoughts! But we must decide relatively soon because interest in the stream's potential is stirring in the Front Office.
